

Abusive Head Trauma Prevention & Sudden Infant Death Syndrome Prevention Training

Caring for our youngest and most vulnerable children is a rewarding, yet challenging job. Crying is an infant or toddler's main way of communicating their needs, but do you have a plan for when it becomes overwhelming? Shaken Baby Syndrome (a form of Abusive Head Trauma) and Sudden Infant Death Syndrome are two risks to very young children in your care, but there are steps we can take to reduce that risk. 

Family Navigation Specialist

Is your child in need of supportive services?

Our Family Navigation Specialists work with families to screen children for Children's Long-Term Support Programs in La Crosse and Monroe counties. These programs are designed for children who have developmental, physical or mental health needs, and programming can offer a wide range of supportive services that allow children to thrive in their homes and communities! Our specialists specifically screen families for the following programs: Children's Long Term Support Waiver Program (CLTS), Children's Community Options Program (CCOP), and Comprehensive Community Services (CCS). To determine functional eligibility, families work closely with our specialists to complete a Functional Screen. With this, our specialists will ask questions to gather information about your child's health, well-being, and current need for supports. Once the Functional Screen is completed, the report will determine which programs your child may be eligible for. Birth to 3: Interpreter Tips

You may see some families at play groups or out in the community that may have an interpreter with them. Here are a few tips of how to work with an interpreter and interact with families utilizing one:

- Introduce yourself to the interpreter, but then talk to the child or adult and use their preferred pronouns versus speaking or asking questions to the interpreter.
- Make eye contact while talking with the child or adult, not the interpreter.
- It's best if only one person talks at a time and if you leave time for the interpreter to translate.
- If you ever have any questions, just ask! Families with interpreters want to be involved, it just may take a little extra step to connect.


